





Radical Secularism

“Authentic democracy is possible only in a state ruled by law on the basis of a correct view of the human person...Nowadays there is a tendency to claim that agnosticism and skeptical relativism are the philosophy and the basic attitude which correspond to democratic forms of political life. Those who are convinced that they know the truth and firmly adhere to it are considered unreliable from a democratic point of view, since they do not accept that truth is determined by the majority or that it is subject to variation according to different political trends. It must be observed in this regard that if there is no ultimate truth to guide and direct political activity, then ideas and convictions can easily be manipulated for reasons of power. As history demonstrates a democracy without values easily turns into open or thinly disguised totalitarianism.” (CA, 46)

Dictatorship of Relativism

“Without truth, without trust and love for what is true, there is no social conscience and responsibility, and social action ends up serving private interests and the logic of power...”^{CIV, 5}

CST: How do I do this?

“What is Truth?”

“Anyone who lives and proclaims the faith of the Church is on many points out of step with the prevalent way of thinking...Today’s regnant agnosticism has its own dogmas and is extremely intolerant regarding anything that would question it and the criteria it employs.”




